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#### I. INTRODUCTION

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On April 3, 2000, the Court filed an Order Concerning Status of Service on Defendants. Docket #227. Among other things, that order provided that Mineral County should file and serve any motions and supporting documentation to dismiss certain proposed defendants in early August of 2000. On August 8, 2000, Mineral County filed a Motion to Dismiss and Substitute Proper Defendants ("the "Motion to Dismiss and Substitute"). The Motion to Dismiss and Substitute lists the names of several individuals and entities that Mineral County seeks to dismiss and the names of several individuals and entities that Mineral County seeks to substitute. It also attaches documentation to support Mineral County's position with respect to these individuals and entities (the "Supporting Documentation"). Finally, the Motion to Dismiss and Substitute is supported by an Affidavit of Treva J. Hearne (the "Hearne Affidavit").

Set forth below is the Walker River Irrigation District's (the "District') response concerning the individuals and entities listed in the Motion to Dismiss and Substitute. In preparing its response, the District attempted to apply the law of this case as set forth in this Court's orders entered on February 25, 1999 at Docket #252 (the "Publication Order") and March 2, 1999 at Docket # 257 (the "Dismissal Order").

## II. THE DISTRICT'S RESPONSE CONCERNING SPECIFIC INDIVIDUALS AND ENTITIES

## Robert T. Adams / Vivian Adams

1. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Robert T. Adams, deceased, and substitute Vivian Adams in his place. The Court discussed the status of Robert T. Adams as a proposed defendant at length in the Publication Order (pp. 12-15) noting that "Mineral County should at the very least ask the known relatives of [Mr. Adams] for what information they may readily have." *Id.* at 14. The Supporting Documentation indicates that Vivian Adams made a written representation to Mineral County that she is "the sole heir of Mr. Robert Adams and his water rights did revert to" her. That statement, however, says nothing about the identity of the current owner(s) of the water rights. The identity of the current owner(s) can be ascertained

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only by researching the public records in the County in which the land with appurtenant water rights is located. This fact is evidenced by computer research conducted by legal counsel for the United States Board of Water Commissioners, Linda Bowman. See Exhibit A attached hereto.

Ms. Bowman's research indicates that Vivian Pellecchia Adams Oster, as

Trustee of the Vivian Adams Trust, conveyed real property located in Mono County, California
to Gregory Burton Adams and Richard Taylor Adams by Grant Deed dated September 24,
1996. Based on this information, the Court should grant the dismissal but deny the substitution
sought by Mineral County. It appears that Gregory Burton Adams and Richard Taylor Adams
should be substituted and served pursuant to FRCP 4.

## Alpers Ranch, Co. Inc. / Fred E. Alpers

2. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Alpers Ranch Co., Inc., as a defunct corporation, and substitute Fred E. Alpers, individually. The Supporting Documentation does not verify that Alpers Ranch Co., Inc. is a defunct corporation. The District's assessment records indicate that Frederick E. Alpers and Barbara L. Alpers are assessed as co-trustees of the F&B Trust. The Supporting Documentation includes a quitclaim deed that conveys groundwater rights to Fred E. Alpers and/or Barbara L. Alpers. With respect to the Alpers, however, Mineral County has submitted no documentation concerning title to Walker River Decree water rights. Therefore, the Court should deny the motion to dismiss and substitute until Mineral County provides documentation to verify that Alpers Ranch Co. Inc. is a defunct corporation and to identify who holds title to the water rights (i.e., Fred Alpers, individually, Fred and Barbara Alpers or F&B Trust).

### Annett's Mono Village / Annett's Mono Village, Inc.

Mono Village, Inc. The Supporting Documentation indicates that Annett's Mono Village, Inc. is a Nevada corporation and that the law firm of Walther, Key, Maupin, Oats, Cox and LeGoy act as its registered agent. Mineral County has served Norm Annett on behalf of Annett's Mono Village. In the Supporting Documentation, however, Norm Annett is not listed as an

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officer or agent of Annett's Mono Village, Inc. (See FRCP 4(h)(1)). Therefore, the District currently has no objection to this dismissal and substitution, however, Mineral County should be required to effect service on Annett's Mono Village, Inc. as required by FRCP 4 or to show that Norm Annett is an officer or managing agent of it.

### Juan Arrache / Arrache Family Trust

4. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Juan Arrache and substitute the Arrache Family Trust, Ronald B. Arrache, Trustee. The Publication Order denies service through publication for Juan Arrache and requires Mineral County to exercise due diligence to identify Juan's heirs. See Publication Order at 15. The Supporting Documentation indicates that Ronald B. Arrache executed a waiver of service form as heir to Juan Arrache and as Trustee of the Arrache Family Trust. The Hearne Affidavit indicates that Ms. Hearne was unable to locate the name Arrache in the files of the Lyon County Recorder. The Hearne Affidavit, however, does not state that Ms. Hearne conducted research in the public records of Mono County, California. The Hearne Affidavit also states that Ronald B. Arrache informed Ms. Hearne "that he is the trustee of the Arrache Family Trust and that the Trust owns water rights that formerly belonged to his father Juan Arrache," deceased. Ms. Hearne does not state that the trust received all water rights previously owned by Juan Arrache prior to his death. Under these circumstances, the Court should deny the motion to dismiss and substitute.

## Fred C. Batchelder and Josephine S. Batchelder / Josephine S. and Fred C. Batchelder 1983 Family Trust

5. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Fred C. Batchelder and Josephine S. Batchelder and to substitute the Josephine S. and Fred C. Batchelder 1983 Family Trust, Connie B. Jansen and Leonard Batchelder, co-trustees. Based on the Supporting Documentation, the District currently has no objection to this dismissal and substitution.

#### Albert Bayer / Mildred Bayer

6. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Albert Bayer, deceased, and substitute Mildred Bayer. The Supporting Documentation indicates that Mildred has provided a written representation to Mineral County that she is "the sole heir to Mr. Albert Bayer and that his

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water rights" reverted to her. As discussed above with respect to Adams (see para. 1 above), however, that statement says nothing about the identity of the current owner(s) of the water rights. Under these circumstances, the Court should grant the motion to dismiss but deny the motion to substitute until Mineral County submits the relevant chain of title documentation to verify the identity of current owner(s) of the water rights.

#### Anna M. Blades and Jerry L. Blades / Richard H. Bein and Ellen Bein

substitute Richard H. Bein and Ellen Bein. The Supporting Documentation indicates that Jerry L. Blades and "Anna M." Blades received title to land with appurtenant water rights pursuant to a grant, bargain and sale deed in March of 1992. The Supporting Documentation also indicates that Jerry L. Blades and "Regina" Blades conveyed the land to the Beins. The Supporting Documentation, however, does not provide an explanation as to the discrepancy in title between "Anna M." Blades and "Regina" Blades. The District's independent research, however, revealed a quitclaim deed wherein Anna M. Nuttal, formerly "Anna M." Blades, conveyed her interest in the land to Jerry L. Blades prior to the conveyance to the Beins. The District, therefore, currently has no objection to this proposed dismissal and substitution. As demonstrated by the Supporting Documentation, however, Richard H. Bein and "C." Ellen Bein should be substituted.

#### John R. Hargus and Adah M. Blinn Trust / Robert Lewis Cooper

8. Mineral County seeks to dismiss the John R. Hargus and Adah M. Blinn Trust, John R. Hargus and Adah M. Blinn, co-trustees, and substitute Robert Lewis Cooper as the successor trustee of that Trust. The District currently has no objections to this dismissal or substitution.

#### Maurice Bliss and Agnes C. Bliss / Janet Bliss Hunewill and Stanley L. Hunewill

9. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Maurice Bliss and Agnes C. Bliss and substitute Janet Bliss Hunewill (already named in the caption) and Stanley L. Hunewill (already named in the caption). The District currently has no objection to the proposed dismissal.

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### Bromley Properties / Thomas J. Bromley and Muriel L. Bromley

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10. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Bromley Properties and substitute Thomas J. Bromley and Muriel L. Bromley. The Supporting Documentation indicates that Bromley Properties conveyed land with appurtenant water rights to Thomas J. and Muriel L. Bromley by grant, bargain and sale deed dated July 12, 1999. The Supporting Documentation also indicates that Muriel Bromley was personally served on behalf of Bromley Properties in February of 1998. Under these circumstances, the District does not object to the proposed dismissal and substitution, however, the Court should require Mineral County to serve Thomas J. Bromley (see Publication Order at 63) and perhaps Muriel L. Bromley in her individual capacity.

#### Vernon F. Bryan, Inc. / Vernon F. Bryan, individually

11. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Vernon F. Bryan, Inc. and substitute Vernon F. Bryan, individually. The Dismissal Order granted Mineral County's previous motion to dismiss the proposed defendants listed in the caption as "Brown, Vernon and Maggie Bryan." See Dismissal Order at 9. The Dismissal Order also stated that "everyone's records agree that the proper defendant is Vernon F. Bryan, Inc." Id. The District's assessment records continue to assess Vernon F. Bryan, Inc. The Supporting Documentation indicates the corporate status of Vernon F. Bryan, Inc. as "revoked 09/01/1997." Under these circumstances, the Court should deny Mineral County's motion to dismiss Vernon F. Bryan, Inc. and to substitute Vernon F. Bryan, individually. The Court should also require Mineral County to serve Vernon F. Bryan, Inc. pursuant to FRCP 4.

### Michael A. Casey and Claudia C. Casey

Mineral County seeks to dismiss Michael A. Casey and Claudia C. Casey. The 12. Supporting Documentation includes a grant, bargain and sale deed involving "water rights" apportioned by the Truckee-Carson Irrigation District". That deed obviously should be disregarded for purposes of the Motion to Dismiss and Substitute. The Supporting Documentation also contains a grant, bargain and sale deed wherein Michael and Claudia Casey conveyed "water rights apportioned by the Walker River Irrigation District" to William Stone. The District's assessment records, however, continue to assess Michael Casey and

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Claudia Casey in connection with reserved water rights. Under these circumstances, the Court should deny Mineral County's motion to dismiss Michael A. Casey and Claudia C. Casey.

#### Diane A. Cutler / Walker River Land Corp.

13. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Diane A. Cutler and substitute Walker River Land Corp. Based upon the District's assessment records, the District currently does not object to this proposed dismissal and substitution.

#### Charles E. Day and Lucille M. Day / William M. Weaver, Jr. Revocable Trust

14. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Charles E. Day and Lucille M. Day and to substitute the William M. Weaver, Jr. Revocable Trust (the "Weaver Trust"), William M. Weaver, Jr. and Rosemary F. Weaver, Trustees. The Supporting Documentation includes a letter from Linda Bowman, legal counsel for the United States Board of Water Commissioners, to Ms. Hearne dated August 7, 2000. The letter indicates that the Weaver Trust is currently assessed by the United States Board in connection with lands previously held by the Days, but that "one cannot solely rely on the Assessment records of the United States Board but must check the local Recorder's records to confirm that the property was, in fact, transferred to this Trust by the Days." The Supporting Documentation also contains several deeds, however, none of these deeds involve the Weaver Trust. Therefore, the Court should deny the motion to dismiss and substitute until Mineral County provides documentation that verifies the Weaver Trust as the current water right holder.

#### Iginia M. Del Porto / Iginia M. Moreda

15. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Iginia M. Del Porto and substitute Iginia M. Moreda. The District currently does not object to this proposed dismissal and substitution.

#### George O. Fitz / Edward Stockton and Linda A. Stockton

16. Mineral County seeks to dismiss George O. Fitz and substitute Edward Stockton and Linda A. Stockton. The District currently has no objection to this proposed dismissal and substitution.

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## George W. Friedhoff / Helen Friedhoff

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Mineral County seeks to dismiss George W. Friedhoff and substitute Helen 17. Friedhoff (already named in caption). Mineral County, however, has failed to provide any information "to determine who inherited the water rights that once belonged to" George W. Friedhoff. Publication Order at 13. The Supporting Documentation, in the form of a Return of Service, indicates that the individual serving Helen referred to her as the heir to George Friedhoff. This reference, however, is insufficient without additional documentation. See Publication Order at 12-15. The Court should deny this proposed dismissal.

#### Don R. Gable Trust / Don R. Gable, individually

Mineral County seeks to dismiss the Don R. Gable Trust and substitute Don R. 18. Gable, individually. The District currently has no objection to this proposed dismissal and substitution, however, as demonstrated by the deed contained in the Supporting Documentation, Don "Ray" Gable should be substituted.

#### Virginia M. Giodo / Joseph A. Giodo Revocable Trust

Mineral County seeks to dismiss Virginia M. Giodo and substitute Joseph Giodo 19. and Anna Nannini. The District's assessment records indicate that this assessment is currently billed to the Joseph A. Giodo Revocable Trust, Joseph A. Giodo, trustee (the "Giodo Trust"). The District currently has no objection to this proposed dismissal and the substitution of the Giodo Trust.

## Harvey E. Hunewill and Phyllis Hunewill / Harvey E. Hunewill and Phyllis P. Hunewill Trust

Mineral County seeks to dismiss Harvey E. Hunewill and Phyllis Hunewill and 20. to substitute the Harvey E. Hunewill and Phyllis P. Hunewill Trust (the "Hunewill Trust"), Harvey E. Hunewill and Phyllis P. Hunewill, Trustees. The Court has previously denied service through publication and the dismissal of Harvey E. Hunewill because Mineral County failed to exercise due diligence to determine his heirs. See Publication Order at 42, Dismissal Order at 13. The Supporting Documentation contains the first page of three different deeds which transfer real property to the Hunewill Trust. One deed is dated August 25, 1986, another dated February 24, 1990 and the year of the third deed cannot be determined due to the poor

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quality of the copy provided in the Supporting Documentation. The District's assessment records indicate that Harvey Hunewill and Phyllis Hunewill are currently assessed as individuals. Under these circumstances and without further documentation, the Court should deny this proposed dismissal and substitution.

#### Joyce Jenkins / Larry D. Jenkins

21. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Joyce Jenkins and substitute Larry D. Jenkins (already named in caption). The Court previously denied service through publication on Joyce Jenkins because Mineral County failed to "demonstrate that due diligence was exercised to find Joyce." See Publication order at 45. Ms. Hearne apparently researched the records at the Lyon County Recorder's office, however, she did not conduct research in the public records of Mono County, California. See Hearne Affidavit at para 4.C. The Supporting Documentation includes a Waiver of Personal Service of Motions signed by Larry D. Jenkins as heir to Joyce Jenkins. Mineral County has provided no documentation, however, to verify that Joyce is in fact deceased or to verify that Larry is in fact Joyce's sole heir. See, e.g., Publication Order at 12-15. Under these circumstances, the Court should deny this proposed dismissal.

#### Junction Range / Arnold Settelmeyer and the Bently Family Limited Partnership

22. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Junction Range and substitute Arnold
Settelmeyer and the Bently Family Limited Partnership. The Supporting Documentation
contains a quitclaim deed from Bently Nevada Corporation to Bently Family Limited
Partnership. Exhibit A to the quitclaim deed apparently describes the water rights conveyed,
however, Mineral County failed to provide Exhibit A in the Supporting Documentation.

Mineral County has provided no documents which reference Junction Range or Arnold
Settelmeyer. Furthermore, computer research conducted by Linda Bowman indicates that
Settelmeyer Ranches, Inc. et al. owns real property located in Mono County, California and that
the mailing addressee associated with the title documents for that real property is Bently
Agridynamics. See Exhibit A attached hereto. Under these circumstances, the Court should
deny this proposed dismissal and substitution.

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### L.T.R. Enterprises / Gary D. Morgan, Marianne Morgan, Vincent Dye and Kathleen Dye

Mineral County seeks to dismiss L.T.R Enterprises and to substitute Gary D.

2 Morgan, Marianne Morgan, Vincent Dye and Kathleen Dye. The Supporting Documentation 3 4 contains three deeds. In the first deed, L.T.R. Enterprises conveyed real property, without 5 6 7 8 9 10 11

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specifically referencing water rights, to the Morgans in 1988. In the second and third deeds L.T.R. Enterprises conveyed water rights under Permit Nos. 45858 and 22060 to the Dyes in 1990 and 1991. The District's assessment records indicate that Casino West, Inc. is currently

assessed in connection with assessments previously billed to L.T.R Enterprises. Therefore, it

appears that the Supporting Documentation and the District's assessment records agree that

L.T.R. Enterprises no longer holds water rights, but, disagree with respect to the identity of the new owner(s). The Court, therefore, should grant the motion to dismiss but deny the motion to substitute until Mineral County provides documentation that verifies the identity of the current

water right holder.

### George Linscott and Louise Linscott / Jean Pace, Administrator

Mineral County seeks to dismiss George Linscott and Louise Linscott and to 24. substitute Jean Pace, Administrator. The Supporting Documentation consists of copies and partial copies of deeds, a death certificate, an affidavit of death of joint tenant, a summons and an Order Setting Aside Estate without Administration and Ordering Immediate Distribution (the "Estate Order"). Those documents and partial documents reveal that the Linscotts apparently owned two parcels of real property in Lyon County prior to their death. It is unclear as to whether both or only one parcel has appurtenant water rights, however, one parcel is located in the City of Yerington and most likely does not have appurtenant water rights. George and Louise are deceased, George having died before Louise. A partial copy (first page only) of an Affidavit of Death of Joint Tenant describes a deed of trust involving the parcel located in the City of Yerington, however, because only the first page is provided, it cannot be determined if this affidavit involves the other parcel and, more importantly, if Louise was vested with title to both parcels as the surviving joint tenant after George's death. The

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Supporting Documentation also only provides the first page of the Estate Order. This first page

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appears to confirm Jean Pace as the administrator or executor of Louise's Last Will and Testament. However, because only the first page of the Estate Order is provided, it cannot be determined if the Estate Order addresses the two parcels located in Lyon County and, if so, the identity of the individual vested with title to the two parcels as a result of the entry of the Estate Order. Under these circumstances, the Court should deny the dismissal and substitution.

Finally, service on Jean Pace is insufficient even if the Court grants the requested dismissal and substitution. As demonstrated by the Supporting Documentation, Pace was served with a summons requiring an answer, within 20 days of service, to a complaint that has not yet been filed with the Court.

#### Lucinda Menesini / Donald Menesini

25. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Lucinda Menesini and substitute Donald Menesini (already named in caption). The Court previously denied service through publication on Lucinda Menesini because Mineral County failed to exercise diligence to locate her heirs. See Publication Order at 50. The Supporting Documentation consists of a Return of Service form wherein the process server referred to Donald Menesini as heir to Lucinda. The process server's description of Donald as Lucinda's heir is insufficient absent documentation to establish this fact and to establish that Donald is Lucinda's sole heir. See Publication Order at 12-15. The Court, therefore, should deny this proposed dismissal.

#### Rose Alice Minister / Bolton-Rose Trust

26. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Rose Alice Minister, individually, and to substitute the Bolton-Rose Trust, Bolton Francis Minister, Trustee. The District currently has no objection to this proposed dismissal and substitution.

#### Monica R. Moore and Anthony P. Moore / Alfred Palmer and Joy L. Palmer

27. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Monica R. Moore and Anthony P. Moore and to substitute Alfred Palmer (already named in caption) and Joy L. Palmer (already named in caption). The Supporting Documentation includes a deed whereby Anthony P. Moore and Monica R. Moore conveyed real property located in Lyon County to Alfred W. Palmer and Joy Lee Palmer. The District's assessment records, however, indicate that William K. Vicencio

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and Susan Steneri are currently assessed in connection with assessments previously billed to the Palmers. Therefore, the Supporting Documentation and the District's assessment records appear to agree that Monica R. and Anthony P. Moore no longer hold water rights, but, disagree with respect to the current owner. The Court should, therefore, grant the motion to dismiss but deny the motion to substitute until Mineral County verifies the identity of the current owner.

#### Helen Nagel / Diane Nagel

28. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Helen Nagel, deceased, and substitute Diane Nagel. The District currently has no objection to this proposed dismissal and substitution.

#### Guido Nannini / Anna Nannini

29. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Guido Nannini and to substitute Anna Nannini (already named in caption). The District's assessment records indicate that the Anna Nannini Revocable Trust, Anna Nannini, trustee (the "Nannini Trust") is currently billed in connection with this assessment. The District currently has no objection to this proposed dismissal and substitution of the Nannini Trust.

#### Robert D. Olson / Curtis & Sons Construction, Inc.

30. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Robert D. Olson and substitute Curtis & Sons Construction, Inc. The District currently has no objection to this proposed dismissal and substitution. With respect to corporations, FRCP 4(h)(1) requires service on an officer or agent of the corporation. The Supporting Documentation contains a Return of Service indicating personal service on Brent Curtis as the "owner of Curtis & Sons". The Court should require Mineral County to provide documentation that Brent Curtis is an officer or agent of Curtis & Sons Construction, Inc. in order to verify effective service.

#### Josiah Peeples / Norma Peeples

31. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Josiah Peeples and to substitute Norma Peeples (already in caption). The District currently has no objection to this dismissal.

33. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Modesta Per	riseau and substitute Pamela Haas
The Hearne Affidavit states that "I believe, based upon conve	ersations with Modesta Perriseau,

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Joint Tenant indicating that Anne M. Riva is deceased and that Herbert R. Riva currently holds title to real property in Lyon County as the surviving joint tenant. Therefore, it must be assumed that Mineral County actually seeks to dismiss Anne M. Riva and substitute Herbert R. Riva (already in caption). The District currently has no objection to the dismissal of Anne M. Riva. It should be noted that the caption currently lists "Hervert" R. Riva instead of "Herbert" R. Riva. The Court should enter an order correcting this typographical error.

### Sario Livestock Company / Kyle Vaughan and Leona Vaughan

35. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Sario Livestock Company and substitute O. Kyle Vaughan and Leona Vaughan. The Supporting Documentation contains a grant, bargain and sale deed wherein Sario Livestock Company conveyed real property located in Lyon County to the Vaughans. Computer research conducted by Linda Bowman, however, indicates that Sario Livestock Company still owns several parcels of real property located in Mono County, California. See Exhibit A attached hereto. The Court should, therefore, deny the dismissal and grant the substitution, however, the Vaughans must be served in accordance with FRCP 4.

The Supporting Documentation also contains one page from a grant, bargain and sale deed wherein Sario Livestock Company conveyed real property located in Lyon County, Nevada to Sierra Nevada Landco, Inc. Mineral County, however, has not moved to substitute this corporation. The Court should require Mineral County to demonstrate why it has not moved to substitute Sierra Nevada Landco, Inc.

#### Jackie Sceirine / Beverly Sceirine

36. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Jackie Sceirine, deceased, and to substitute Beverly Sceirine. The Supporting Documentation contains an order entered in the matter of the estate of Jackie Sceirine. The copy of the order provided is of poor quality and is missing the last page(s), however, certain things may be discerned from the order. First, Jackie's sons, William Todd Sceirine and Michael Duane Sceirine were named as co-executors of the estate. Second, after Jackie's death, a dispute arose between his sons and Jackie's widow, Beverly Sceirine, concerning ownership of the real property commonly referred to as the Sceirine

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Ranch. The Third Judicial District Court of Nevada apparently ruled (last page(s) of order
missing) that Beverly Sceirine owns only one-sixteenth (1/16) of the Sceirine Ranch. The
identity of the individual(s) who own the remaining fifteen-sixteenths (15/16) of the Sceirine
Ranch cannot be verified from the copy of the order provided, however, they are most likely
William Todd and Michael Duane Sceirine. In any event, Mineral Court must substitute the
individuals owning the remaining fifteen-sixteenths (15/16) of the Sceirine Ranch, in addition
to Beverly Sceirine. Under these circumstances, the Court should grant the motion to substitute
Beverly Sceirine and deny the motion to dismiss Jackie Sceirine until Mineral County identifies
the remaining owners of the Sceirine Ranch and the current owners of any lands owned by
Jackie Sceirine prior to his death located in Mono County, California.

#### Gary Silva and Tildean Silva / Sunrise Ranch LLC

37. Mineral County seeks to dismiss Gary Silva and Tildean Silva and to substitute Sunrise Ranch LLC. The District currently has no objection to this dismissal and substitution.

### T.F. Snyder

38. Mineral County seeks to dismiss T.F. Snyder. The Hearne Affidavit indicates that the name T.F. Snyder was researched "in the Lyon County records." The District currently has no specific objection to this dismissal, however, it would be helpful to know exactly what "records" were researched in Lyon County. In addition, if it has not already done so, Mineral County should research the name T.F. Snyder in the public records of Mono County, California.

#### William Stone

39. Mineral County seeks to dismiss William Stone. The District currently has no objection to this dismissal.

## George Swainston and Dorothy Swainston, individually / Swainston Family Trust

40. Mineral County seeks to dismiss George Swainston and Dorothy Swainston, individually, and to substitute the Swainston Family Trust, George and Dorothy Swainston, Trustees. The District currently has no specific objection, however, as evidenced by the deeds

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contained in the Supporting Documentation, the substitution should involve the George D. Swainston Family Trust, George D. Swainston and Dorothy W. Swainston, co-trustees. Virginia Creek Hyrdo, Inc. / The Trust for Public Land Mineral County seeks to dismiss Virginia Creek Hydro, Inc. and to substitute 41. The Trust for Public Land. The District currently has no objection to this proposed dismissal and substitution. Gilbert C. Wedertz Mineral County seeks to dismiss Gilbert C. Wedertz. The Hearne Affidavit 42. states the following in this regard. The only document I located regarding Gilbert Wedertz was a conveyance by a Martha Burke Wedertz, with no mention of Gilbert, and no mention of water rights and I found nothing else in the name Wedertz, indicating he has no water rights. Ms. Hearne does not indicate where she conducted research in an attempt to locate documents involving Gilbert Wedertz or attach the document involving Martha Burke Wedertz. Under these circumstances, the Court should deny the motion to dismiss until Mineral County provides additional information concerning its attempts to identify Gilbert Wedertz as holding

## Glenora F. Wright / Lee and Glenora Wright Family Trust

Mineral County seeks to dismiss Glenora F. Wright, individually, and to 44. substitute the Lee and Glenora Wright Family Trust, Lee C. Wright III and Glenora F. Wright, trustees. The Supporting Documentation includes partial copies of certain deeds that, in some instances, have been copied in a manner such that the information on the left-hand side of the document cannot be read. It appears from these partial copies and from independent research


