I. Introduction.

On or about January 9, 2001, Mineral County filed a Motion to Dismiss and Add Certain Parties Status Report (the "Motion to Dismiss and Add"). The Motion to Dismiss and Add alleges that 101 persons must be dismissed, 73 persons added and 8 persons served through publication in this matter. It also alleges that "[d]ue diligence has been completed on those need [sic] to be served by publication." Motion to Dismiss and Add at 2.

II. The Court Must Deny Any Relief Requested By The Motion To Dismiss And Add Because It Does Not Identify The Defendants Mineral County Seeks To Dismiss Or Add Or Serve By Publication.

The Motion to Dismiss and Add completely fails to identify the proposed defendants that Mineral County now seeks to dismiss or add or serve through publication. It also fails to offer any documentation or other evidence in support of the relief requested. Under these circumstances, it is impossible for the Walker River Irrigation District (the "District") or any other party to respond to the Motion to Dismiss and Add. The Court, therefore, must deny any relief requested by the Motion to Dismiss and Add until, at a minimum, Mineral County identifies the defendants it seeks to dismiss or add and those it seeks to serve through publication and also provides the Court with supporting documentation. In addition, all parties including the District must be given an adequate opportunity to respond after Mineral County provides this identification and documentation with respect to its Motion to Dismiss and Add.

III. Status Report.

The Motion to Dismiss and Add also purports to be a "status report". Apparently, this is because the Motion to Dismiss and Add alleges that 954 persons have been served and service is out with respect to another 28 persons. Once again, the District is unable to address these allegations based on the information contained in the Motion to Dismiss and Add. The District, however, believes that it is important to inform the Court concerning the District's position as to the current status of this matter.

On April 3, 2000, the Court entered an Order Concerning Status of Service on Defendants. Docket No. 326. Among other things, that order listed the proposed defendants that Mineral County had properly served with respect to its Intervention Documents. It also

listed the proposed defendants that Mineral County had failed to serve, the proposed defendants
that Mineral County intended to dismiss from the action and those whom it intended to serve
through publication.

The Court also entered a scheduling order on April 3, 2000 (Docket No. 327), setting forth filing deadlines with respect to Mineral County's anticipated motions. That order stated the following:

Mineral County shall file and serve all motions to dismiss and substitute proposed defendants on or before August 7, 2000; responses shall be filed and served on or before September 8, 2000; replies shall be filed and served on or before September 29, 2000.

Information to supplement the record shall be filed and served on or before July 7, 2000; objections thereto shall be filed and served on or before August 7, 2000; responses thereto shall be filed and served on or before September 8, 2000; replies in support thereof shall be filed and served on or before September 29, 2000.

Mineral County shall file and serve motions for permission to serve by publication any proposed defendants on or before October 31, 2000; responses thereto shall be filed and served on or before November 30, 2000; replies in support thereof shall be filed and served on or before December 22, 2000.

A. Status Concerning Dismissal and Substitution.

On or about August 8, 2000, Mineral County filed a Motion to Dismiss and Substitute Proper Parties. Docket No. 354. That motion requested that the court dismiss and substitute several parties and stated that "more substitutions may be required" in the future.

On September 8, 2000, the District filed the Walker River Irrigation District's Response to Mineral County's Motion to Dismiss and Substitute Proper Parties. Docket No. 358. The District's response individually addressed the defendants Mineral County seeks to dismiss and substitute as set forth in its Motion to Dismiss and Substitute Proper Parties. The District's response also pointed out that Mineral County's August 8, 2000 motion failed to address 13 proposed defendants that were listed in the April 3, 2000 order as defendants for which Mineral County intended to file a motion to dismiss or substitute.

On or about September 28, 2000, Mineral County filed its Reply to Response Motion to Dismiss and Substitute Proper Parties. Docket No. 361. Mineral County's reply responded to

the District's comments as set forth in its September 8, 2000 response. Mineral County's Motion to Dismiss and Substitute Proper Parties (Docket No. 354) now appears to be fully briefed by the parties and ready for decision by the Court. Status Concerning Supplementation of the Record by Mineral County. В. The April 3, 2000 order required Mineral County to file and serve all information to supplement the record with respect to its service efforts on or before July 7, 2000. Mineral County filed nothing in this regard on or before July 7, 2000, however, it has filed additional Return of Service forms and other documentation as follows: Several Return of Service forms and other documents attached to a 1. Request for an Extension of Time in which to Complete Service (the "Request") filed by Mineral County on or about October 20, 2000 (Docket No. 363) Certificates of Returns of Service, Waivers of Service, and Attempts to 2. Locate, filed by Mineral County on or about November 15, 2000 (Docket No. 370); By order dated October 27, 2000 (Docket No. 364), the Court granted Mineral County until December 26, 2000, in order "to complete the service and file its motions with the Court." In addition, the District filed the Walker River Irrigation District's Response to Mineral County's 16 Request for an Extension of Time in which to Complete Service on November 7, 2000. Docket 17 No. 368. The District's response to the Request informed the Court that the District will 18 respond to the information attached to the Request after December 26, 2000 (the new deadline set by the Court in its October 27, 2000 order) or at another appropriate time in the future. 20 21 22 23 24 25
